## Keynote Speaker

### You Look So Familiar

*Caprice Smith & Rodney Hill*

This workshop will explore Internet Social Sights, Facebook, Myspace, etc. and highlight how they diminish the normal boundaries of personal safety; making people vulnerable to phony relationships and maltreatment. Participants will be shown how online connections transcend into physical ones, how they solidify real life relationships and the consequences thereof. Participants will view video & hear about real life scenarios.

## Morning Workshops

### 101 The New Net Commodity: Human Trafficking

This workshop will highlight how the Internet is being used to perpetuate Human Trafficking, by luring young people, organizing businesses and bargaining favors, while enabling the aggressors to avoid apprehension. Participants will view video & dissect real life scenarios.

### 102 An Intimate Look at Alcohol and It's Sobering Facts

*Joseph Ryan*

Alcohol use is something that can easily destroy the dreams and hopes of our children and their families. You will view a reenactment of underage drinking after a high school prom and the community consequences related to the poor decisions of adults and youth. A closer look will be given to a local story that involves "Jessie's Story". You will see the destruction of alcohol on two separate families and ways to prevent underage drinking.

### 103 Developing Healthy Behaviors (Part 1)

*Suzanne Cox*

Sometimes treatment providers, counselors or teachers become vulnerable to impairment from emotional problems, substance abuse or stress from their day to day life. This workshop will identify common risk factors associated with burnout and impairment. We will address guidelines for self assessment of impairment or burnout. Attendees will become familiar with prevention strategies and treatment options for impaired professionals.

### 104 Strategic Listening and Reflective Communication: Moving Beyond Blame
